

Door Security Procedures

This module is designed to provide the learner with an understanding of the security duties and procedures for those working doors of pubs, nightclubs, fast food outlets and theatres.

It satisfies the minimum training requirements, determined by the Private Security Authority, for the licensing of individuals working with the door security industry.

Who Will Benefit?

Existing Door Supervisors and those hoping to work as Door Supervisor in the Security Industry and meet with the licensing requirements of the PSA.

Entry Requirements

There are no formal entry requirements for any of our security courses.

Qualification

The duration of the programme is 2 days.
